Jesus asks them to follow, to be sure, but he also tells them that they will become "fishers of men," that they will be asked to share the Good News with others. As we gather today let us think about how we share our faith with others through what we do.

INTRODUCTION TO THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Jonah 3:1-5, 10 The Ninevites turned from their evil way

Psalms 25 Teach me your ways, O Lord.

1 Corinthians 7:29-31 The world in its present form is passing away.

Mark 1:14-20 Repent and believe in the Gospel.

There is an urgency in today's readings. Nineveh will be destroyed if the people do not repent within forty days. Saint Paul tells the Christian community in Corinth that "time is running out." Jesus proclaims, "This is the Time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand." Deadlines can inspire us to action. As we listen to the readings today, imagine how the folks addressed by Jonah, Paul, and Jesus responded to this urgency.
